Sigma Nu and former Knox VP Brian Williams resigns



Accepts development position at the Indianapolis Children's Museum



Brian Williams '86, DT 970, and former vice president for advancement at Knox College left in April to become vice president for development at The Children's Museum of Indianapolis, Indiana.

Williams majored in American Studies and won the Dorothy Inness Stanford Award for outstanding academic achievement in American history. He graduated with academic honors from Indiana University Law School in 1989. He was active in choir, tennis, soccer, and, of course, Sigma Nu.

"Brian has brought Knox College a more systematic and intentional approach to fundraising," said Knox College President Roger Taylor. "He has built an able, dedicated, and highly motivated staff at Knox, and his new position represents a well deserved endorsement of his ability and reputation."

After graduating from law school, Williams served as a judicial clerk at the United States Court of Appeals for the Seventh Circuit in Chicago, then practiced law until 1992. He completed a master's degree in American history at the University of Wisconsin in 1994, then taught law at Northwestern University and Cornell University Law School, before coming to Knox in 2000.
